

<u>Please join our</u> <u>Patient</u> <u>Participation</u> <u>Group!</u> What is the Patient Participation Group or PPG?

A Patient Participation Group (PPG) is a group of people who are patients of the surgery and who wish to take a more active interest in finding out more about the practice or would like to influence the development of local health services. The idea is for staff and patients to work together to share ideas to help patients to take more responsibility for their own health and to help improve the services offered at the practice.

The NHS requires every practice to have a PPG.

### Will my views be heard?

Your views are important and will be listened to. It may not be possible to act on every suggestion, but all feedback is valuable and will be took into consideration. Working in a spirit of mutual respect, openness and trust, all patients' views will be discussed ad, where appropriate, we will work together on solutions. ### What will be required from members?

Apart from the annual meetings we will ask the members some questions from time to time about our services. We will contact you via email and keep our surveys short so it should only take a few minutes of your time.
